

General Data Protection Regulations

In accordance with the GDPR Statement

GDPR stands for General Data Protection Regulation and replaces the previous Data Protection. It was approved by the EU Parliament in 2016 and comes into effect on 25th May 2018. GDPR states that personal data should be 'processed fairly & lawfully' and 'collected for specified, explicit and legitimate purposes' and that individuals data is not processed without their knowledge and are only processed with their 'explicit' consent. GDPR covers personal data relating to individuals.

We* are committed to protecting the rights and freedoms of individuals with respect to the processing of participants, visitors and staff personal data. The Data Protection Act gives individuals the right to know what information is held about them. It provides a framework to ensure that personal information is handled properly.

What we* do with your Data:

- We* do not disclose or sell personal data to third parties. We* assure you that we* do not pass on your personal data to third parties, unless we* are legally obliged to do so or you have given us* your prior consent. Insofar as we* use service providers to carry out and process processing, the contractual relationships are governed by the provisions of the Federal Data Protection Act.
- We* do not disclose personal data to other members who are not directly related to the organization and management of the BsB Festival.
- We* store your personal information until the purpose for which it was entrusted to us* is fulfilled. Insofar as commercial and tax retention periods must be observed, the storage period for specific data may be up to 10 years.
- We* oblige our* BsB Festival team to hold the same standards on data protection as us*.
- The personal data entering via the contact formula or the registration form are only used to process the services you contacted us* for and needed to uphold the quality of that service.

Newsletter

If you wish to receive the newsletter offered on the website, we* require an e-mail address from you, as well as information that allows us* to verify that you are the owner of the e-mail address provided and that you agree to receive our* newsletter. Further data are not collected or only on a voluntary basis. We* use this data exclusively for the delivery of the requested information and do not pass it on to third parties.

The processing of the data entered into the newsletter registration form takes place exclusively on the basis of your consent (Art. 6 (1) lit. GDPR). You can revoke your consent to the storage of data, the e-mail address and its use for sending the newsletter at any time, for example via the "unsubscribe" link in the newsletter. The legality of the already completed data processing operations remains unaffected by the revocation.

The data deposited with us* for the purpose of obtaining the newsletter will be stored by us* from the newsletter until your subscription and deleted after cancellation of the newsletter. Data that has been stored for other purposes with us* (such as e-mail addresses for the members area) remain unaffected.

Consent and revocation

You can ask us* to delete your personal data at any time. Data for billing and accounting purposes are not affected by a termination / cancellation or deletion of personal data.

Cookies

Cookies are small files that make it possible to store specific device-related information on users' access devices (PCs, smartphones, etc.). They serve for the user-friendliness of web pages and thus the users (for example storage of login data). On the other hand, they serve to record the statistical data of the website usage and to be able to analyze it for the purpose of improving the offer. Users can influence the use of cookies. Most browsers have an option to restrict or completely prevent the storage of cookies. However, it is pointed out that the use and especially the comfort of use are limited without cookies. Server logs

The provider of the pages automatically collects and stores information in so-called server log files, which your browser automatically transmits to us*. These are:

- browser type and browser version
- used operating system
- referrer URL
- host name of the accessing computer
- time of the server request.

These data can not be assigned to specific persons. There is no merge of this data with other data sources. We* reserve the right to check this data retrospectively, if we* become aware of specific indications for illegal use.

Embedded videos

This website might bind videos from external portals such as YouTube. The embedded clips store cookies on users' computers when the page is opened. Anyone who has disabled the setting of cookies for the Google advertising program will not have to expect any such cookies when calling up YouTube clips. However, these portals (YouTube and Vimeo) also store non-personal usage information in other cookies. If you want to prevent this, please block it in your browser.

Your rights, information

If you no longer consent to the storage of your personal data or if it has become incorrect, we* will initiate the deletion or blocking of your data or make the necessary corrections (as far as this is possible under current law) upon a corresponding instruction. Upon request, you will receive free information about all personal data that we* have stored about you.
